AFFIDAVIT OF RANDY DYCK

I, Randy Dyck, of Langley, in the Province of British Columbia MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS THAT:

1. I am the Assistant Pastor of Riverside Calvary Chapel (the "Church"), one of the petitioners herein, and as such I have personal knowledge of the matters herein deposed to except where stated to be on information and belief and where so stated, I verily believe them to be true.
2. On Sunday Nov 29, 2020, our Church was visited by two bylaw officers and six RCMP officers. One of the bylaw officers came into our church before the first service began. He called for RCMP officers and two RCMP officers came out during our first service. One of the RCMP officers called a Supervisor who came to the church along with another three officers. I spoke with two of the, first to arrive, officers. The officer who wrote and handed me the ticket, advised me that we had already been warned by the bylaw officer, so instead of this being an educational visit by the RCMP, we would be receiving a \$2300.00 ticket. He then asked me for my name and phone number.

3. The officers gave me a ticket for \$2300.00 issued to Riverside Calvary Chapel. One of the RCMP officers told me that they would return later that day and issue more tickets if we were still meeting. They said that individuals attending our service would risk being ticketed as well.
4. For the next service, we had 2 bylaw officers come along with 3 RCMP Officers. I observed a concerned citizen, though not a member of our church, Kari Simpson, asked the officers on what basis we were being ticketed. The officers were unable to show any documentation or written order by which they were ticketing us.
5. The three RCMP officers then huddled up with the two bylaw officers and soon after got in their cars and drove away. No ticket was issued, and no one came back for our third and last service of the day.
6. On Sunday, December 6, 2020, I observed two bylaw officers drove into the parking lot of our Church. They did not get out of their vehicles. They observed members of the Church entering the building. They then drove off.
7. I have read the Affidavit of Brent Smith. I agree with the facts set out therein and also agree with and share the religious beliefs Brent describes, including about the essential importance of gathering together in-person as the Church. I am profoundly concerned that cancelling our in-person worship gatherings would have a very negative impact on the emotional, physical and spiritual well-being of individuals within our Church.
8. I swear this Affidavit *bona fide* in support of the Petition for Judicial Review, and for no improper purpose.
